- If you are picking up your child(ren), please arrive prior to **2:50** and wait outside by the main door. We will continue to dismiss students being picked up like we did last year. Students will begin to be called for dismissal around 2:50. Please bring a photo ID, such as a driver's license, with you to show the staff on duty.
- If you plan on picking your child(ren) up at dismissal the first day or any day for the remainder of the year, please send in a note or email mhspickup@gmail.com. This is the best email address to communicate pickup changes to our main office.
