US News Rankings



- 80% of the total score comes from assessment data (NJSLA, AP)
 - College Readiness (30%)
 - % of 12th graders who took ≥ 1 AP test
 - College Curriculum Breadth (10%)
 - % of 12th graders who took > 4 AP tests

In these categories, three-fourths of the score is dependent on students passing the exams with a score ≥ 3 .



State Assessment Proficiency (20%)

 Score comes from school's performance on math/reading NJSLA scores compared to state scores overall

State Assessment Performance (20%)

 Score come from expected math/reading NJSLA scores based on demographics

 The remaining 20% of the overall score comes from the Graduation Rate (10%) and Underserved Student Performance (10%)

- 72% of exam scores are proficient (score of 3 or higher)
- Goal: To Increase proficiency to 80% of exam scores.

Recommendations for Improvement in this Category



- Require all students enrolled in AP courses to take the exam
- Consider covering a portion of the test fee for lower income families,
 students taking multiple exams, & families with multiple children testing.
- Expectations for AP course rigor must be made clear prior to enrollment so the pacing and depth can meet College Board requirements.
- Consider re-establishing an entry requirement prior to enrollment in an AP course.



- As an additional incentive, offer a partial refund of exam fee for students who earn passing grades. (50% refund for a 5, 40% for a 4, 30% for a 3)
- Celebrate the AP culture! Reward those students with a breakfast or some other activity after the AP exam period.
- Highlight the success of the AP program and share stats for graduates who have earned college credit.

- Increase Dual Enrollment opportunities
- Expand our Senior Initiative program
- Advertise the Senior Initiative options to both students & parents starting in junior year via:
 - Class meetings
 - Website
 - Back to School Night
 - Hometown Pride
 - Scheduling Conferences

Suggestions for Improving Our State Proficiency & Performance Scores

- Increase vertical articulation between Macopin & WMHS
- Review recently released 2022 NJSLA scores to determine whether current placement procedures for acceleration into Algebra 1 & Geometry in grades 7-8 are appropriate & successful.
- Consider establishing a minimum grade requirement to advance from accelerated courses in Macopin to WMHS.
- Consider making prior year's NJSLA score a data point in determining placement in accelerated courses.

Culture & Climate - Student Time In Class



What can we do to support and motivate students academically?

- We would like to take a look at the "frequent flyers" who are often late to class and out of class (bathroom/nurse or absent).
- We would use this data to analyze these students and their grades and test scores.
- We would like to work with student organizations, such as PALs and support staff to help mentor and monitor these students.
- We must inform students how standardized testing impacts them.
- Revisit the policies for lates and absences.
