The District will follow all New Jersey Department of Education and New Jersey Department of Health regulations. Masks will be optional during the 2023-2024 school year.

There wit be no cohorts or pods; all students will be in class every day for a full day of school.

3) Handwashing and respiratory etiquette ([count] of 1000 maximum characters used)

The District will encourage proper hand washing and respiratory etiquette (cover your cough, catch your sneeze)

4) Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation ([count] of 1000 maximum characters used)

District custodial and maintenance staff will continue to use commercial grade botanical (plant-based) disinfectant to clean and disinfect all our school facilities. These bleach-free, phosphate-free, non-corrosive disinfectants target broad spectrum efficacy and are used in health care facilities, hospitals, nursing homes, surgery centers, aging care facilities, etc. Specifically, they have been proven effective in killing SARS-CoV-2. All unit ventilators have been refurbished as part of a larger District-wide Energy Savings Improvement plan.

5) Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the State, local, territorial, or Tribal health departments ([count] of 1000 maximum characters used)

The District continues to collaborate with the West Milford Health Department, Passaic County Health Department, and the NJ Department of Health, and will follow all official protocols disseminated by these agencies.

6) Diagnostic and screening testing ([count] of 1000 maximum characters used)

Parents are strongly recommended to keep their child(ren) home from school if they present COVID-19 symptoms, following the NJ Department of Health guidance: headache, sore throat, fever of 100.4 degrees F or greater, cough, shortness of breath, chills, muscle pain, new loss of taste/smell, fatigue, congestion or runny nose, nausea, or vomiting, or diarrhea. Staff or students must wash their hands or use hand sanitizer after they cough or blow their nose; primary grade students (K-2) must be supervised when using hand sanitizer. All schools have the capability to isolate a student who presents as ill during the school day.

Students will have access to school counselors, social workers, and/or school psychologists every day they are in school. School-based mental health providers will be prepared to service students and meet their individual needs due to COVID-19 experiences. Moreover, the Child Study Team and counseling department are prepared to acknowledge the potential trauma that staff and students have faced during the COVID-19 pandemic. The full impact of this pandemic and the collateral consequences from isolation, fear, loss, and economic hardship, have yet to be fully realized. These challenges will be addressed through individual counseling, counseling groups, and social/emotional learning that continues to be infused into everyday school life.
